Completion of Areas I-V (2) Completion of two ENGL/CMLT 2000-level courses (3) Completion of EDUC 2110 and EPSY 2130 (4) Passing Score on the GACE program admission assessment or exempt the GACE with the following: *a. 1000 on SAT (Verbal and Quantitative) b. 43 on ACT (Math and English)* (5) Overall GPA of 2.6 (6) Submission of a 3-5 page purpose statement (7) Submission of a resume that documents experiences working with young people, work experience that is relevant to a career in education, extracurricular activities, academic awards and honors.

**Required Courses:** *A grade of "C" (2.0) or better must be achieved in all Major courses. Competency in one foreign language through the fourth semester is required.*
