Conducted research on the Anglo-Italian poet Christina Rossetti and her support of the Risorgimento. I argued that Rossetti supported the Italian national cause, citing biographical evidence (her family ties to the Risorgimento), highlighting Italian literary influence on her works, examining her references to Risorgimento events and culture, and studying her poems written in Italian. I argued that the current view of Rossetti—fails to capture her political interests, and that these political interests were integral to her works. Successfully defended, only with minor revisions.
